- 4. Adhere to federal, provincial, and professional policies and regulations associated with Applied Behaviour Analysis (ABA).
- 5. Develop a reflective practice, using professional development and self-care strategies to enhance professional competence.
- 6. Develop client-centered behavioural intervention plans that account for individuals' rights, needs, goals, and their social and community context.
- 7. Design and implement behaviour change plans for individuals, families and/or groups, based on principles of learning and behaviour therapy, current research and evidence-based practice.
